## Reenactment for a hero of the American Revolutionary War

Macharaviaya travelled back in time last Saturday for a reenactment of the battle of Pensacola, Florida, in which General Bernardo de Gálvez led his forces to defeat British troops during the American Revolutionary War. His intervention was considered so decisive in the triumph of the American troops, that during the 4th of July military parade, he marched beside George Washington as a tribute to recognise his support of the American cause.

More than 100 actors and members of the association Granaderos y Damas de Gálvez y Torrijos 1831 dressed in 18th century clothing.

The group interpreted what was the battle that would tip the scales in favour of the American colonies. José de Gálvez, descendent of the heroic figure, played the star role. The reenactment included new activities such as the screening of short films, and included more music and dialogue.

The town hall decided to postpone the act to 9pm in order to allow temperatures to cool down and to draw a larger audience. As a result the turnout for the event was over 1,000. Visitors and residents had the opportunity to enjoy local as well as American food and drink. There was a barbecue as well as fireworks and dancing.
